Cookies

To make this site work properly, we sometimes place small data files called cookies on your device. Most big websites do this too.

What are cookies?

A cookie is a small text file that a website saves on your computer or mobile device when you visit the site. It enables the website to remember your actions and preferences (such as login, language, font size and other display preferences) over a period of time, so you don't have to keep re-entering them whenever you come back to the site or browse from one page to another.

How do we use cookies?

We use cookies to remember users' actions, and to record page visits anonymously (e.g. Google analytics). They are not essential for the website to work. We control the cookie-related information (website or third party), except for Google analytics. Cookies will not be used for any purpose other than those stated.

We use cookies to remember if you have agreed (or not) to our use of cookies on this site. You can withdraw consent by deleting the cookies (see below) and rejecting them next time you visit.

We use Google Analytics, a popular web analytics service which uses cookies to help us to count the number of people that visit our site and to analyse how they use it (e.g. we can determine which pages on our site are the most popular ones).

The information generated by the cookies about your use of our website (including your IP address) will be transmitted to and stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google will use this information for the purpose of evaluating your use of our website, compiling reports on website activity and providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage. Google may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where such third parties process the information on Google's behalf. Google undertakes not to associate your IP address with any other data held by Google.

The cookie-related information is not used to identify you personally and the pattern data is fully under our control. These cookies are not used for any purpose other than those described here.

A number of our pages use cookies to remember if you have agreed (or not) to our use of cookies on this site. You can withdraw consent by deleting the cookies (see below) and rejecting them next time you visit.

How to control cookies

You can control and/or delete cookies as you wish – for details, see <u>advice from the ICO</u>. You can delete all cookies that are already on your computer and you can set most browsers to prevent them from being placed. If you do this, however, you may have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit a site and some services and functionality may not work.
